CITY COUNCIL MEETING

A work session was held beginning at 3:00 p.m. and the regular meeting of the Coleraine City Council was held at 4:00 p.m., **Monday, November 27**th, **2023**, in the Council Chambers of Coleraine City Hall.

WORK SESSION

Public Works Supervisor Rogich explained the school's request to shut down the public parking lot across from the school on Thursday, December 21st from student and staff access. The lot will open an hour before the Holiday concert for public to park in.

Clerk-Treasurer Anderson gave a brief overview of the numbers for the Stormwater project and what Coleraine's contribution match might be. The monies for the match were committed in the special projects fund long ago.

Street Lighting Project – the advertisement for bids with a cost estimate sheet was presented to Council along with design drawings by City Engineer Olson (SEH). The bid opening is scheduled for January 3, 2024 at 10:00 am in Council Chambers and the Council may consider bids at their regular meeting on January 8th. **Motion** by Councilperson Sobtzak with support from T. Troumbly **to approve and go out for bids.** Roll Call: Ayes: Councilpersons Sobtzak, T. Troumbly, Giving, and Mayor Nielsen. Nays: none. Motion carried.

Cash Match – Stormwater Retrofit project—ISWCD – Anderson reported that the project is coming in under budget and that Andy Arens and she were still working on the in-kind numbers which will reduce the cash match. \$60,000 had been set aside in Fund 200; the cash match will be no more than \$55,050. Motion by Councilperson Sobtzak, supported by Giving, to approve the pay out of up to \$55,050 upon receipt of an invoice by ISWCD. Roll Call: Ayes: Councilpersons Sobtzak, Giving, T. Troumbly, and Mayor Nielsen. Nays: none. Motion carried.

¼ page ad in Greenway Blast – Motion by Mayor Nielsen with support from Councilperson Giving to approve a ¼ page ad in the Greenway Blast at a cost of \$80.00. Roll Call: Ayes: Mayor Nielsen, Councilpersons Giving, Sobtzak, and T. Troumbly. Nays: none. Motion carried.

CEDA contract – **Motion** by Mayor Nielsen, supported by Sobtzak, **to approve the contract with changes and to be paid for out of the Blandin IASCDG funds.** Roll Call: Ayes: Mayor Nielsen, Councilpersons Sobtzak, T. Troumbly, and Giving. Nays: none. Motion carried.

Public parking lot across from school – Motion by Mayor Nielsen with support from Councilperson T. Troumbly to approve the request and block off the public parking to GHS staff and students until 8:30am to accommodate parking for the guests of the $K-4^{th}$ grade choir concerts. Ayes: all. Nays: none. Motion carried.
